I want to remind you about our service for Maundy Thursday this week. Maundy means "mandated" reminding us of Jesus' mandate to us in John 13:34-35. He says, "A new commandment I give to you — Love one another!" This command is what we honor at the service as we remember Jesus' last night before His crucifixion. In liturgical terms, this is called a "Tenebrae" service. Tenebrae is a Latin phrase meaning "darkness" or "shadows." As the service progresses, the lights are dimmed and candles extinguished, allowing darkness to take a larger place just like it did on the night Jesus was arrested. I hope you'll join us for this meaningful time of remembrance.

GOOD FRIDAY PRAYER TIME • 7 AM TILL 7 PM

On Good Friday, our chapel doors will be open from 7 AM to 7 PM. There's no program, music, preaching, or schedule – just a quiet time for prayer, meditation, and reflection.
